### Champagne

**Janisson & Fils, Brut Tradition,  
à Verzenay N.V. \$72.**  
(a D.C. Flynt Selection)

*70% Pinot Noir, 30% Chardonnay, cellar aged 30 months. The attack is fresh and harmonious with a gentle, enticing acidity. The effervescence reinforces the freshness and galvanizes the taste. As the wine temperature rises it develops a soft, almost velvety texture. Hints of marshmallow and almond give the cuvee a real distinctness.*

**Morgan, Reisling, Double L Vineyard,  
Monterey 2014 \$44.**

*Appealing nose of green apple, nectarine, orange blossoms. Traditional Riesling flavors of apple cider, minerals, and a touch of lemon zest work beautifully with the wine's refreshing bright acidity. The wine is slightly off-dry style and low alcohol (much like a traditional German "Kabinett".)*

## Blended White Wine

**François Lurton, Les Hauts de Janeil,  
Languedoc-Roussillon, France 2015 \$28.**

*Complex and powerful nose, notes of flowers, peach and oak aromas (nuts and almond). Lots of volume but also fresh with notes of spices. The finish is highlighted by a touch of acidity due to aromas of grapefruit.*

**Ch. La Négly, Les Terrasses,  
Languedoc, France 2015 \$31.**

*A beautiful, salty, citrus and apple-filled white, the 2015 IGP Pays d'Oc Terrasses de la Negly, which is a concrete tank aged blend of Chardonnay and Sauvignon Blanc, is medium-bodied, clean, beautifully balanced and fresh. This is a high quality white that will be versatile on the dinner table and drink well for 2-3 years.*

**Dirler-Cade, Edelzwicker, "Réserve",  
Alsace, France 2016 \$35.**

*The term "Edelzwicker" (noble blend) is Riesling with Pinot Gris, Pinot Blanc, and Sylvaner. The cleanest fruit from the estate's top sites qualifies for the "Réserve" bottling, a tincture of pink sandstone and limestone terroir. Fermented and matured in foudres, the backbone of Riesling is present with sweet citrus and candied florals. There's a noticeable texture that finishes into a perfectly ripe but not sweet finish. The wine is technically dry, less than 7 grams of sugar per liter.*

**Château Haut Gléon Blanc, Languedoc,  
Corbières, France 2016 \$61.**

*60% Roussanne, 40% Grenache Blanc, a complex fruit bouquet (quince paste and dried fruit), accompanied by some floral hints (honeysuckle, acacia) and touches of spice (vanilla, cinnamon). Rich and harmonious on the palate, set off nicely by spice and butter flavors. Good length, with a dominantly fresh sensation.*

*Coming from l'Ermite, Les Rocoules, Maison Blanche and Peleat lieux-dits, it's always a rough blend of 80% Marsanne and 20% Roussanne that's aged in barrel. Loaded with notions of honeysuckle, orange marmalade, powered rock, buttered citrus and green almond, it's full-bodied, rich, upfront and fruit loaded. it will be relatively accessible early in its life, it has the concentration to hold for two decades.*

*The flagship Borsao Garnacha is mostly Garnacha complemented with Syrah (in some years it might have a little Tempranillo), depending on the year. This is also fermented in stainless steel with neutral yeasts and bottled unoaked. The Syrah might give it a little touch and some oomph in the nose, somehow spicy and a touch smoky from the skins of the variety.*

*The palate is fleshy and juicy, very tasty, with unnoticeable tannins. It goes down easily with a velvety sensation.*

**El Castro de Valtuille**, Mencia Joven, Bierzo 2014 \$31.

*Lurid violet color. Asian spice- and mineral-accented dark berries and floral oils on the perfumed nose. Juicy and focused on the palate, offering vibrant black raspberry and bitter cherry flavors that spread out nicely with aeration. Finishes sappy and gently sweet, with fine-grained tannins, a hint of gaminess and very persistent dark berry character.*

*This is a blend of young-vine fruit from 13 different counties in California.*

*Pale to medium ruby-purple, the 2017 Zinfandel Juvenile is scented of cinnamon toast and licorice with warm red currants, cranberries, warm black berries and cherries with blue fruits and spicy hints. Light to medium-bodied, it has a good core of fruit in the mouth with loads of warm spices coming through, framed by softly textured tannins and juicy acidity, finishing long and spicy.*

**Steacy Ranch**, Lodi 2016 \$62.

*A new bottling from a vineyard planted in 1907 in sandy soils that includes significant proportions of Grenache and Carignan among its Zinfandel vines, the 2016 Zinfandel Steacy Ranch exhibits lovely aromas of cassis, plums, dried Provençal herbs, cherries and black tea. On the palate, the wine is medium-bodied, supple and succulent, with melting tannins and an ample, giving profile.*

**Rinaldi Vineyard**, Amador 2016 \$70.

*Returning to the Turley portfolio after a few years' hiatus, the 2016 Zinfandel Rinaldi Vineyard exhibits an attractive bouquet of creamy balsamic cherries, rose petals, spring flowers and cracked black pepper. From a higher elevation, cooler climate site, the wine is full-bodied, chewy and concentrated, with a deep and tangy profile. It will merit at least a few years' bottle age.*

*Leviathan was founded in 2004 by winemaker Andy Erickson, former winemaker of Screaming Eagle Winery. The goal was simple: to create one, unique red wine, drawn from some of the best vineyards in Northern*

*California. The resulting bottling, was born of a passion for blending Cabernet Sauvignon, Syrah, Merlot and Cabernet Franc, to create a full bodied wine with a character all of its own.*

#### **Cuvelier Los Andes, Grand Vin**, Uco Valley 2013 \$67.

*Grand Vin is our “First Label”. We like to introduce our Grand Vin as the Argentinean cousin of Château Léoville-Poyferré, 2nd Grand Cru Classé from Saint-Julien, our family’s most renowned Estate in Bordeaux, France. Grand Vin is an exceptional Bordeaux-style blend, with an impressive tannic structure from our best Malbec, rounded, balanced and completed with Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Syrah and Petit Verdot.*

*55% Cabernet Sauvignon; Pine Ridge Vineyards, Napa*

*19% Syrah; Double Canyon, Horse Heaven Hills*

*Nose of smoked black cherry, black plum, tobacco leaf, cigar box, sweet baking spice, toasty oak, dried leaves and summer forest. #### **Paraduxx**, Napa 2012 \$94.

**Winemaker is Lake Charles native Don Laborde;**

*60% Cabernet Sauvignon, 37% Zinfandel, 3% Petit Verdot*

*The nose offers enticing layers of spicy brambleberry, as well as hints of ripe blackberry and oak-inspired vanilla cream. Ripe red-fruited raspberry notes dominate the palate of this lovely blend, underscored by deeper layers of blueberry and spice. Beautifully balanced tannins carry the flavors through to a long, satisfying finish.*

**L'Aventure, *Optimus*, Paso Robles 2014 \$98.**

*Made from 42% Syrah, 33% Cabernet Sauvignon and 25% Petit Verdot, it's a supple, seamless and elegant wine that gives a small window into the quality and style from this terrific estate. Its deep purple color is followed by classy notes of black raspberries, spice box, dried flowers and underbrush in a full-bodied, balanced and lengthy package.*

### Meritage & Bordeaux

**Revelry Vintners, The Reveler,  
Columbia Valley 2016 \$49.**

**Ch. Sociando Mallet, Haut-Medoc 2012 \$66.**

*55% Cabernet Sauvignon, 40% Merlot and 5% Cabernet Franc. Wonderfully sweet, ripe tannins seem to be a rule of thumb from this great terroir just to the north of St.-Estèphe's Château Montrose. A beautiful deep ruby/purple color, decent acidity, medium to full-bodied mouthfeel and stunning fruit put this wine right in the midst of the best classified crus from the Médoc, yet it has never been classified. Softer than I would have suspected (and I've been following and buying this wine since the mid-1970s), this wine will still age beautifully for 10-15+ years (Robert Parker.)*

**Maestro, Robert Mondavi, 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary,  
Napa 2013 \$90.**

**Ceyneth, Sonoma, 2014 \$94.**

*A blend of about 60% Cabernet Franc, with 25% Merlot, the rest Cabernet Sauvignon and Malbec. The grapes come primarily from Chalk Hill, but with smaller quantities of fruit from the Jackson Estate vineyards in Bennett Valley, Knights Valley and Alexander Valley. The daughter of Pierre Seillan, Hélène, makes these wines in an elegant, almost St.-Emilion Cheval Blanc style.*

#### **Palazzo, Right Bank, Napa 2009 \$118.**

The 2009 Right Bank is a rock star, an amazingly great effort – along with the 2012 and possibly the 2013 – Right Bank Proprietary Red Wine that Scott Palazzo has made to date. A blend of 68% Merlot, 24% Cabernet Franc, and the rest Cabernet Sauvignon, this wine still followed the trend of 14 months barrel aging in 40% new French oak. Truly great stuff, with a stunningly intense nose of crème de cassis, caramel, high quality espresso and possibly the dark chocolate from the Rhône Valley known as Valrhona, this wine is layered, full-bodied, opulent and stunningly rich, and consequently flirting with perfection. What’s amazing is that Scott Palazzo told me the harvest for the 2009 was one of the latest ever, extending into the first week of November. The result is a killer effort, although still an adolescent in terms of its evolution, with a good 15 or more years of life ahead of it.

#### **Ch. Les Carmes, Haut Brion, 2012 \$118.**

##### **Italics, Proprietary Red Blend,**

##### **Coombsville 2015 \$120.**

The 2015 Italics Proprietary Red Wine opens with cassis and raspberries. The mid-palate is rich and creamy, tempered by a fruit-based acidity. The mouthfeel has a graphite texture, intermingling with the mid-palate and delivering length and density to the finish. As a Bordeaux blend, it combines the softness of Merlot with the intensity of Cabernet Sauvignon, and seasoned with trace amounts of Petit Verdot and Cabernet Franc to give it layers of fruit and complexity

#### **Ch. Lassegue, St. Emilion 2010 \$140.**

From American Jess Jackson’s vineyard in St.-Emilion (run by the incomparable Pierre Seillan), the 2010 Lassegue possesses an opaque purple color as well as a dense, muscular, masculine style displaying lots of black cherry and black currant fruit intermixed with hints of new oak and graphite. Full-bodied but backward, this cuvee (like most of Seillan’s wines) is built for the long haul. It requires 5-7 years of patience and should last for 20+ years.

#### Cannonball, *High Dive* 2015 \$143.

The wine's 'Left Bank' Bordeaux style blends Cabernet Sauvignon with additional Bordeaux varietals; Merlot, Cabernet Franc and Petit Verdot. *High Dive* exhibits aromatics of red cassis, notes of strawberries and crushed blackberries and tones of clove and white pepper. Rich, plush mouthfeel with sweet dark currant and blackberry fruit. Fabulous density and weight, with excellent texture. Bold and complex, with hints of dark chocolate and espresso. Aged 20 months in 60% new French oak.
